#### NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

## CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR AN INTERNATIONAL COURSE ON MEDICAL ASPECTS OF ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION AGAINST CHEMICAL WEAPONS XI'AN, CHINA 14 – 18 OCTOBER 2019

- 1. On behalf of the Government of China and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite Member States to nominate participants for an international course on the medical aspects of assistance and protection against chemical weapons, to be held in Xi'an, China from 14 to 18 October 2019.
- 2. The course is related to assistance and protection against chemical weapons under Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), and will be organised jointly by the Government of China and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat").
- 3. The course has been designed primarily for medical doctors, specialised medical personnel, and medical responders involved in emergency response to chemical incidents. The course will be particularly valuable for physicians and medical professionals involved in providing hospital care to chemical casualties.
- 4. The course will address the physiological effects of chemical warfare agents, acute and chronic health effects of exposure, concepts of medical countermeasures, including antidote therapy and advanced treatment pathways, as well as the principles of mass casualty management, triage, emergency response systems, and hospital emergency plans, among others.
- 5. The course, which will include theoretical lectures, demonstration sessions, and a practical exercise on chemical casualty management, will also facilitate the exchange of information and experience regarding medical assistance and protection practices for victims of this type of incident, in line with the provisions of Article X of the Convention. The provisional programme for the course is included as Annex 1 to this Note.
- 6. Given the purpose of the course and its medical focus and technical nature, candidates will be selected carefully and should have a solid background in emergency medicine, toxicology, or health care associated with protection against chemical weapons and other toxic chemicals. They should belong to national emergency response agencies and other institutions that deal with chemical-related incidents.

- 7. All activities during the course will be conducted in English, and no interpretation services of any kind will be provided. Participants are therefore expected to have a good written and oral command of English.
- 8. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to China.
- 9. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of participants. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, medical insurance, accommodation, and meals, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
- 10. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Sunday, 13 October 2019 and to depart no later than Saturday, 19 October 2019. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants must bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets.
- Interested applicants are invited to register their nomination online through Eventus—the OPCW event management system—no later than 5 August 2019. The Eventus registration link is accessible via the OPCW website (<a href="http://apps.opcw.org/eventus">http://apps.opcw.org/eventus</a>). Please note that all questions marked with an asterisk (\*) in the online system must be answered, and an endorsement letter from the relevant National Authority (Annex 3) must be attached in order for the nomination to be received and for the candidate to be considered for this event. Interested applicants who, for technical reasons, are unable to submit their application online via Eventus are requested to send the nomination form (Annex 2) along with the endorsement from the National Authority (Annex 3) via email (<a href="mailto:EmergAssistBr@opcw.org">EmergAssistBr@opcw.org</a>) with a reference to the name and location of the event in the subject line of the message. The selected participants will be contacted no later than two weeks after the submission deadline.
