# INVITATION TO APPLY FOR TWO RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS IN ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY SKILLS DEVELOPMENT TO BE HELD AT THE VERIFIN LABORATORY, FINLAND, FROM 2022 TO 2023

# Purpose of the fellowships

1. The Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) wishes to invite Member States to nominate two participants for research fellowships "NMR<sup>1</sup> Specialist" and "Synthetic Chemist" for analytical and organic chemistry skills development at the Laboratory of the Finnish Institute for Verification of the Chemical Weapons Convention (VERIFIN) in Finland from 2022 to 2023.

### **Description of the fellowships**

- 2. The programme is organised by VERIFIN and is designed for chemists with relevant practical and theoretical experience in analytical chemistry/bioanalysis or synthetic chemistry. For the first research fellow ("NMR Specialist"), practical experience in analytical chemistry, including sample preparation, as well as a theoretical understanding of nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy and information technology, is an essential prerequisite. For the second research fellow ("Synthetic Chemist"), practical experience in organic synthesis and gas chromatography, as well as a theoretical understanding of organic reactions, is an essential prerequisite. The selected research fellows must be prepared to work independently on a designated project. Although VERIFIN will propose the specific focus of the project, candidates may indicate their own areas of interest.
- 3. practical laboratory component, the first research ("NMR Specialist") will receive training on sample preparation and analysis methods of compounds related to chemical weapons agents, their precursors, degradation products (including metabolites), and by-products of scheduled chemicals, as well as on the identification and confirmation of such compounds, mainly by nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy. The second research fellow ("Synthetic Chemist") will receive training on synthetic methods and purification of compounds related to precursors, degradation products, and by-products of scheduled chemicals (with special emphasis on synthesis), as well as on the identification and confirmation of such compounds, mainly by gas and/or liquid chromatography and nuclear magnetic resonance spectroscopy. The programme will also include the aspects of quality assurance.

#### Time and duration

4. The fellowships will be for a duration of six months, starting in the autumn of 2022. The exact date of commencement of the fellowships will be mutually agreed upon by the selected research fellows and VERIFIN.

#### Selection of the candidates

5. Two candidates will be selected for the fellowships offered under this programme in two phases. The pre-selection of the candidates will be made before 4 July 2022. The final selection by the OPCW will be made before 22 July 2022. Only successful candidates will be informed by the OPCW.

#### Financial assistance

- 6. VERIFIN will provide tutors, equipment, and infrastructure free of charge. The accommodation, daily allowances, travel costs, and medical insurance will be borne by the OPCW.
- 7. In this context, it should be mentioned that VERIFIN will pre-select at least four candidates for the fellowships, whose applications will be forwarded to the International Cooperation and Assistance Division of the OPCW. The Director-General will select the research fellows to be supported by the OPCW, based on the recommendation of the Review Committee. Applications shall comply with the requirements of the OPCW Fellowship Programme, details of which are available on the OPCW website (<a href="www.opcw.org">www.opcw.org</a>).

#### **Eligibility**

8. The fellowship positions are open to citizens of the Member States of the OPCW (a list of which is available on the OPCW website) that are developing countries or countries with economies in transition. It is intended for relatively young chemists with an academic background and laboratory experience as indicated earlier. The candidate should have practical experience with computers and basic software. A good working knowledge of English is a prerequisite. Female candidates are encouraged to apply.

#### **Application procedure**

- 9. Interested candidates should submit their applications on plain paper and should attach the following:
  - (a) an up-to-date curriculum vitae;
  - (b) an essay (not exceeding 300 words) outlining the objectives the candidate wishes to achieve and the type of work experience he or she hopes to acquire during the period of the fellowship;
  - (c) a letter of recommendation from the supervisor of the candidate at the institution where he or she is currently working, indicating how the training will be of benefit to the candidate's present position, institution, and country;

- (d) a completed OPCW Fellowship Programme application form (attached as the Annex to this Note); and
- (e) a copy of the candidate's valid national passport.
- 10. Applications without valid contact information (including mailing address, fax number, and email address) will not be considered. Applications should be received by VERIFIN by 24 June 2022. Incomplete applications or those received after the deadline will not be considered. The applicant should also clearly indicate which fellowship programme he/she prefers ("NMR Specialist" or "Synthetic Chemist"). Applications should be sent to the following address:
